#### **ASU Police**

Located on all ASU campuses, the ASU Police Department is a full-service, 24-hour campus police force. Its crime prevention unit coordinates a variety of safety training classes to ensure all students know how to avoid or react to any unsafe situation.

### **Emergency call boxes**

Located throughout all ASU campuses and parking structures, emergency call boxes are marked with a bright blue light and connect directly to the ASU Police Department.

### Key card access buildings

Many ASU buildings use a key card access system, so on-campus guests may not have access to enter certain buildings. This is to keep our students safe due to ASU being an open and public campus.



Changemaker Central is a student-run centralized resource hub for academic courses and cocurricular activities involving social entrepreneurship, civic engagement, service learning and community service that catalyze student-driven social change.

Devil's Den student lounge and patio includes a student meeting space and is connected to Provisions On Demand Market, a great spot for students to grab a quick snack or beverage (like a Jamba Juice).

The Kiva, a Pueblo Indian word for a ceremonial structure, opened in fall 1989 and seats up to 100 students using portable tables for classes.

A rectangular pool with water fountains highlights **Sands Classroom Building's** west courtyard. Here, students obtain one-on-one help with their speaking and presentation skills, including use of associated technology, at the Communication Assessment and Learning Lab in the Sands third level.



The University Center Building serves as the center of campus life and houses Financial Aid and Scholarship Services, ASU Health Services, the Pat Tillman Veterans Center, and Student Accessibility and Inclusive Learning Services.

The **Paley Gates**, designed by modernist sculptor Albert Paley, link the beginning and completion of a Sun Devil's journey at the West campus. It's tradition for students to touch the gates as incoming first-years and just before their graduation ceremonies.

The Classroom/Lab/Computer Building, with a distinctive notched roofline, contains general purpose and computer classrooms, science laboratories, studios for art, dance and music.

Fletcher Library was the first building completed on the West campus. Group study rooms, the Student Success Center (a free tutoring center for writing, math, science and business) and the Computing Commons are just a few key resources available here.
